A rock solid art exhibition

WHEN sculptor Catriona McCarthy decided to try her hand at painting last year she little imagined just how it would take off.

She entered her first ever canvas, Stepping Out From The Cave Within, for the J J Fox Open Art Competition and the judge - prestigious French artist Philippe Lejeune - rewarded it with second prize. That result, and the favourable comments she received on the work, have inspired her to mount her first exhibition of paintings, Geology, which opened at the Arts Centre's Berni Gallery on Monday.

Developing the theme of Stepping Out, which has been borrowed back from J J Fox International for the exhibition, Catriona has continued to explore the textures and colours of rocks in this collection of acrylics on canvas. The paintings have a bold, photographic quality and mix observation with personal interpretation.

'I try to break down the shapes and the colours into a more blocky style,' she says. 'My starting point for all of these was photography and I've tried to really play with the shape of the picture. Being a sculptor, shapes are important to me.'

Born in Jersey in 1980, Catriona graduated with a BA in sculpture from Edinburgh College of Art in 2002. That same year she won the Scottish Sculpture Workshop Residency Award at the prestigious Royal Scottish Student Academy Exhibition and was twice a runner-up for the Andrew Dolan Sculpture Award as part of the Edinburgh Fringe Festival.

Right light

'I definitely didn't want this to be a landscape exhibition,' she says. 'I wanted it to be rocks - they could be seen as boring, but with the right light and the right reflections you get all sorts of colours. I've also played around with space using triptychs and diptychs, trying something a little bit different.'

'I'm a very methodical painter. These paintings have taken hours to do. But I've enjoyed the last year - it's good for people to try different areas.'
